Linda Valentine-prayers as she continues to battle cancer.


Anna Ruth Franklin-Prayers for several health issues.

NO!

*"My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent.
My son do not walk with them."*

Proverbs 1:10a,15a

*Thomas Wilson was thinking clearly when he said,
"He can never be good that is not obstinate." God trains us
to be good by the same method.*

Stubborn. The Latin word is obstare - to stand against.

*There's a good side to stubbornness. We've maybe written it off as
completely negative.*

*When a little three year old's favorite word seems to be "no!"
parents may fret. (Of course disobedience has a price.)
But later if sinners entice him/her the same resistance
must be exercised.*

*Active opposition must be part of our training. Not merely
'saying no' to sin but being "able to stand against the wiles
(methods) of the devil" (Ephesians 6:11), "to withstand
(stand against) in the evil day, and having done all, to stand
firm" (verse 13). Preparation requires being strong in the
Lord and having on God's whole armour (verse 11).*

*James 4:7 further necessitates submission to God before we resist the devil.
Say "Yes" to God, first, then say "No" to the devil. 1 Peter 5:9 enjoins resisting
the devil with a firm, stable faith (see Colossians 2:5).*

*"No" must be backed up with a solid, spiritual stubbornness against evil.
Stating against comes before standing against.*

*"Having done all, to stand firm" would surely include a stubborn NO!
Not a weak little 'no', but an obstinate
NO! NO, SIR! NOT ON YOUR LIFE! NOT A CHANCE!*

NO!
